and/or implant surgery, implant uncovered,
temporization & slides

**Oct 13 - 14, 2006 Phase IV
Implant Surgery – Stage II & Final
Restorative Treatment**

Finalize preparations, impressions, jaw records
Finalization of case 2 – preps – temps, jaw
records

Cases to lab for finishing

**Nov 10 - 11, 2006 Phase V
Final Case Presentation & Evaluation**

Placement of cases 1 and 2, case presentation
and evaluation

All phases of the Patient Mastery Program are two days in duration, with the first day usually dedicated to patient treatment and documentation. The second day will usually be dedicated to the review of treatment at the UB Esthetic Dentistry Education Center, review of treatment rendered in your office and discussion of treatment that will need to be accomplished at the next phase, or in your office between phases. During Phase I, you will present your fully documented cases for review and discussion. The patient that will be treated at the UB Esthetic Dentistry Education Center must be available for examination on the first day. Also during Phase I, treatment will be finalized for both patients and sequencing of treatment is developed. You will be mentored with respect to interim treatment or preparation needs to be accomplished before the next Phase. Treatment is monitored throughout the program through documentation and evaluation by the faculty.
